

De Kalb May 6th 1811

Dear Sir (Isaac Cooper),

Will you be so kind as to inform me soon, whether you are coming out here in June. A number of persons are anxious to procure deed and give mortgages.

Mr. Cleghorn informs me that he wrote to you some time since to know whether he could have the Hotel a year or two longer, after his lease expires, which will be in November next, but has received no answer. He is very anxious to however to know. James Cooper is also anxious to know what you design to do with the lease of the Mills, as his lease expires in the month of August next.

Will you also be so kind as to inform your brother George Pomeroy that it is highly necessary for him to give Mr. Raymond explicit orders with respect to his salt. Salt is now selling here at \$4 barrel. And the storage is running up to a great sum, as our Ogdensburgh merchants are very unconscionable in their charges. There is about 250 federal majority in this county.
