

De Kalb 19th May 1811

Gentlemen (Richard and Isaac Cooper),

When Richard Cooper Esqr was here I mentioned to him that providing it was agreeable to him and you, we would be glad to lease the place from the time our lease expires until the first of May 1818.

If you will have the goodness to let me know whether you will lease to let us have it & the price you will be oblige me. My reason for troubling you that in case we do not continue here it will be necessary for us to make some shelter on the farm for next winter. And we want to get out the timbers before the spring work begins.
