

De Kalb, Dec. 22, 1806

My Dear Sir,

I have been waiting with very great anxiety to hear from Dimock who left Utica about weeks since with a pretty assortment of goods for us which I purchased of Kane N.R. in Nov. and have never heard from him until this moment. Mrs Dimock has written me that she has just received a letter from him at Sandy Creek where he is shipwrecked. Most of cargo lost together with two of his men. I shall start immediately for Sandy Creek. I expect from what Mrs. Dimmock writes that some of our goods are saved. As soon as I find how the business is I will inform you.
