

Cooper's Village 29th Oct. 1809

Dear Sir,

Since you left this place I have seen Alexander Osburn. I mentioned that John Campbell & my son were going to work at your mill this winter. He also told me that if any person presumed to do anything at that mill that he would prosecute them.

I told him they were going to work by your directions. He answered; he cared not he would prosecute the first person that went there. I have no apprehensions myself but Mr. Campbell wished you to know & having an opportunity by the bearer he requested me to write you on the subject. Mr. Campbell & Humphrey (Cleghorn) goes over next Tuesday to cut their logs & make what repairs are necessary. He desires me to beg an answer & inform him if anything is to be apprehended from Osburn's threatenings. My wife & boys requests your respectful compts (?),
