

General Observation's on that part of the  
Township of Dekalb surveyed by Potter Goff in  
the Summer and Autumn of 1814. Reference to the Map

Tot. N° 1. In the N. Corner of the Town, Choice level Land  
the back part low and a little swampy on Canton Line near  
the corner of said Town, very little or no living water,  
Timbered with Rock Maple, Elm, Beach, Basswood &  
the Low Land, Black ash, Bass, Birch & some hemlock

Tots 2 to and 13. Generally good Land and timbered  
as above, a little broken or swampy on the rear of the 1<sup>st</sup> first  
and some pine timber, A small Cedar Swamp on 8 & 9.  
a small Jamaica Swamp on 10. 11. 12, near the River

Tots. 14 to & 19. A large proportion of low land on the  
Creek, good for meadow, if not too low, On the S E a little  
broken & interspersed with good Pine timber, the 1<sup>st</sup> good  
& the 2 last good NW of the Creek a want of water,

Tots. 20 to & 24. Very level & good for meadow, timber  
with Black ash, Bass. Some Hemlock, poorly watered in  
a dry season,

Tot. 25 to & 31. Level Land, Timbered as above  
25 & 26 mostly hard Land good for grain, A cedar  
swamp on the SW part running near to the Center of  
27. 28. 29. Trifling on the others, saw no living water

Tots. 32 to & 37. not so level as the last, tho'  
not rough, mostly hard timber, A small cedar Swamp  
on the S E part of 33. 34. 35 & very little water

Tots. 38 to & 43. very level, the first good except 5 or 6  
Acres. Swamp on the N E end, 39. 40 mostly swamp  
41. about  $\frac{1}{3}$  Swamp. The rest excellent Land, 42. 43  
Choice Land except a swamp on each end the trifling,  
very little water
