

New York 21st June 1815

Dear Sir (Isaac Cooper),

I send you by Mr. Pomeroy the deeds of partition, which please to have executed, and return to us by a safe private conveyance those which belong to this city.

It will be necessary & proper that Mrs. Cooper, Mr. Richard Cooper's Widow, should sign a release of her right of dower to De Kalb, dated prior to the deeds partition. The sooner this paper is obtained from her the better.

Do you intend to visit De Kalb this summer? I will leave this on Friday next for the Genesee River and expect to return to Utica about the middle of July. When I should like to proceed to De Kalb. If you have any intention of going I should like to go with you about that time. If you have any idea of going please to drop me a line on receipt of this, directed to the care of James Wadsworth Esq. Genesee. Saying what time between the 10 & 15 July you could be at Utica. It will be well to have the partition deeds executed as soon after you receive them as you can.

Please to present my best respects to Mrs. Cooper and believe me
