

Montreal 31st July 1806

Sir,

We have lately been favored with your letter of 14th June, containing an order for sundries, which (excepting the Gin and window glass) we have forwarded to Mr. Benedict in charge of Judge Gates, amounting to Pounds 83..14..11 Canada currency, equal to 335 Dollars.

We could find no genuine Gin in Town, nor more than a box of 8 by 10 glass, a size not commonly imported and there- worth sending. We shall draw upon you payable at New York the 1st of October to Messr. John M. Wickar&fil. and desire them to present the Bill to Messr. John Murray & Sons, whom you will instruct accordingly.

We sent these articles to avoid disappointment, but it would not suit us to undertake the supply of Mr. Benedict's Store, because our importations being adapted to the Indian Trade, very few articles would suit your purpose.
